# Meeting called to order

The meeting was called to order at 10:02am.

# Welcome

The Chairman welcomed Deputy Commissioner Anthony Ennis to the meeting. D/C Ennis will take on the role of Acting Commissioner of Police following the Commissioner's departure in May 2016.

# 3. Confirmation of Previous Minutes

The minutes of the 7 March 2016 meeting were confirmed.

# 4. Matters Arising from the Previous Meeting

# a. ACC Legislation

Members again queried whether the amended legislation would have a retrospective clause in it. The Manager explained that there was no such a clause; however there was a savings provision to ensure that ongoing investigations and/or prosecutions were not jeopardized by the amendments. Members asked the Manager to ensure there was clarity in the law in respect of persons covered under the law, including Members of the Legislative Assembly.

#### b. Staffing

The recruitment process has started for the posts of Investigators and the Manager is working on the development of a job description for the trainee post which will be reserved for a Caymanian, in order to ensure succession planning in the Unit. The Manager confirmed that the post of Senior Investigator will be maintained by the current seconded post-holder.

# 5. Operational Update

The Commission received an update from the Senior Investigator on the 8 ongoing investigations being conducted by the ACU. The purpose of these updates is to provide the members with insight into the types of cases being handled by the ACU and as a result the levels of workload they are experiencing and the resources necessary to handle such workloads. Specific details such as names, locations, dates, etc. are included in a separate schedule due to security issues. Information shared with members is done so to ensure they are able to fully act in their capacity as an oversight body.

The Commission was informed that since inception (1<sup>st</sup> Jan. 2010) there have been 126 complaints registered by the ACC, of which:

- a. 13 are 'pending' awaiting further or sufficient information which may make it appropriate to make further investigations;
- b. 95 have been concluded;
- c. 10 have been transferred to other investigative units for action; and
- d. 8 are under current active investigation.

# 6. Report by the Auditor General and Complaints Commissioner

The Acting Auditor General and Acting Complaints Commissioner provided a short briefing of work of their respective offices which relate to anti-corruption matters.
